Inside, the open-plan galley is bright and inviting, thanks to two side hatches that allow sunlight and fresh air to flood the space. Newly fitted with practicality in mind, the kitchen features a stylish wooden worktop, under-counter oven and two-ring hob, plus a Montpellier fridge and freezer neatly tucked beneath the counter. With plentiful drawers and storage options, it's a well-thought-out space for preparing meals on the move.

The lounge is a cosy retreat, centred around a traditional multifuel stove with a tiled surround—ideal for curling up in colder months. A comfortable two-seater sofa bed offers a flexible sleeping arrangement for guests, while the open flow of the layout creates a real sense of space.
